

Interjurisdictional Recognition of Advance Care Planning

Speaker Bio: Laura Watts is the chair of The Canadian Bar Association's Elder Law Section, former national director of The Canadian Centre for Elder Law and an elder law consultant.

David M. English is the W.F.Fratcher Missouri Professor of Law at the University of Missouri. Professor English is best known for his work with the Uniform Law Commission, for whom he was the Reporter (principal drafter) for the Uniform Trust Code, the Uniform Health-Care Decisions Act, and the Uniform Adult Guardianship and Protective Proceedings Jurisdiction Act. For the American Bar Association, Professor English is currently a member of its House of Delegates, a member of its Commission on Law and Aging, and a member of the Executive Committee of the Section of Real Property Trust & Estate Law. Professor English is co-author of the treatises *Tax, Estate and Financial Planning for the Elderly*, and *Tax, Estate and Financial Planning for the Elderly: Forms and Practice*, published by Matthew Bender & Co., co-author of *Fiduciary Accounting and Trust Administration Guide*, published by ALI-ABA; and co-author of *Wills, Trusts & Estates*, and *Principles of Wills, Trusts & Estates*, published by West Publishing Company.

Professor English received his B.A. in Economics from Duke University and his J.D. from Northwestern University School of Law. Prior to joining the faculty of the University of Missouri in 1998, Professor English taught at the Universities of South Dakota and Santa Clara and practiced law in Chicago. During 2004, he was a Fulbright Visiting Professor of Law at the University of Tokyo. In 2011, the National College of Probate Judges awarded Professor English the Treat Award for outstanding contribution to American probate law.

Linda S. Whitton, Professor of Law at Valparaiso University School of Law, is the Reporter for the Uniform Power of Attorney Act and the current Michael and Dianne Swygert Research Fellow. She is also the ABA Section of Real Property, Trust & Estate Law Advisor to the Joint Uniform Law Commission/Uniform Law Conference of Canada Study Committee on Inter-Jurisdictional Recognition of Life Planning Documents. Professor Whitton teaches courses in Elder Law and Property and frequently speaks and publishes on a variety of elder law topics. She is the co-author of *Everyday Law for Seniors* (Paradigm 2012) with Lawrence Frolik
